Can Improve Your Game

Need a target to focus on for skill improvements? The EWGA Chapter Championship is your opportunity to compete in a tournament format with other Dallas members in your skill level. You can compete in stroke play or in a scramble on a 4-person team. It's your choice.

But I'm not good enough to play. Championship does not mean that you have to be the best player in the Chapter, just the best in your skill level. There are 5 flights in stroke play from the best, experience players to the newest in the game of golf. The Low Gross and Low Net winner in each flight advance along with the 1st place Team Scramble Competition winners.

In 2009, no flight had more than 8 entrants (*see below for # of entrants in each flight for 2009*) and most had fewer. There were 3 scramble teams and only one entrant in the 4th flight who automatically advanced to the Semi-Final. (NOTE: Handicap ranges for each flight have increased by 3 or 4 points in the Championship, 1st and 2nd flights.)

Handicap Index Range Stroke Play Flight

(Scramble Factor for Individuals on Scramble Team in parens)

0 - 12.0 Championship Flight (+2) - 2 entrants
 12.1 - 19.0 First Flight (+1) - 4 entrants
 19.1 - 25.0 Second Flight (0) - 6 entrants
 25.1 - 32.0 Third Flight (-1) - 2 entrants
 32.0 - 40.4 Fourth Flight (higher than 40.4 allowed for scramble-2)
 - 1 entrant

What do you do to qualify?

- Be a female EWGA member in good standing
- **Have a verifiable USGA Handicap Index with the equivalent of two 18-hole scores posted to your handicap record prior to May 31st, 2010 (handicap cut-off date).**
- Be an amateur as defined by USGA Rules of Amateur Status
- Register by May 30, 2010

What are the stages of the Championship?

- 1)The Dallas Chapter Championship, an 18-hole local qualifying round on June 13th at Bridlewood Golf Club in Flower Mound.
- 2)The Semi-Final Championship, an 18-hole round held at 15 venues from June 26th - August 2, 2010. (NOTE: The Texas Semi-Final will also be at Bridlewood!)
- 3)The EWGA Championship Finals, a two-day, 36 hole event held at Geneva National Golf Club in Lake Geneva, WI on October 1-2, 2010.

Handicap Corner | Measure Your Potential

Do I Post a Score for Match Play?

Yes. You should post your score after you finish your match.

Here's how to figure your score for each hole:

- Write down your score for every hole that you hole out.
- If a hole is conceded, write down the score you would most likely receive on that hole
 - If a short putt is conceded, assume that you made the putt and note your score accordingly
 - If you are on the green but would probably two putt from that location, add two strokes to what you already have and note that score
 - If you are off the green, again, mentally figure the score you would most likely get and note that score
- If you finish your match before you complete 18 holes and you elect not to play in, take par, add any handicap strokes you would receive on each hole, and write down the score for those holes.
- If your match goes beyond 18 holes, only post your score for your 18 hole round.

Dropping/Re-Dropping and Nearest Point of Relief

By Whom and How

A ball to be dropped must be dropped by the player herself. She must stand erect, hold the ball at shoulder height and arm's length and drop it.

If a ball is dropped by any other person or in any other manner and the error is not corrected before making a stroke, the player incurs a one-stroke penalty and must re-drop in accordance with the rules.

If the ball when dropped touches any person or the equipment of any player before or after strikes a part of the course and before it comes to rest, the ball must be re-dropped, without penalty. There is no limit to the number of times a ball must be re-dropped in these circumstances.

Where to Drop

When a ball is to be dropped as near as possible to a specific spot (e.g. lost ball so dropping from where last stroke was played), it must be dropped not nearer the hole than the specific spot which, if it is not precisely known to the player, must be estimated.

A ball when dropped must first strike a part of the course where the applicable Rule requires to be dropped.

When to Re-Drop

A dropped ball must be re-dropped, without penalty, if it:

- (i) rolls into and comes to rest in a hazard;
- (ii) rolls out of and comes to rest outside a hazard;
- (iii) rolls onto and comes to rest on a putting green;
- (iv) rolls and comes to rest out of bounds;
- (v) rolls to and comes to rest in a position where there is interference by the condition from which relief was taken under Rule 24-2b (immovable obstruction), Rule 25-1 (abnormal ground conditions), Rule 25-3 (wrong putting green) or a Local Rule (Rule 33-8a), or rolls into the pitch-mark from which it was lifted under Rule 25-2 (embedded ball);
- (vi) rolls and comes to rest more than two club-lengths from where it first struck a part of the course; or
- (vii) rolls and comes to rest nearer the hole than:
 - (a) its original position or estimated position (see Rule 20-2b) unless otherwise permitted by the Rules; or
 - (b) the nearest point of relief or maximum available relief (Rule 24-2, 25-1 or 25-3); or
 - (c) the point where the original ball last crossed the margin of the water hazard or lateral water hazard (Rule 26-1).

If the ball when re-dropped rolls into any position listed above, it must be placed as near as possible to the spot where it first struck a part of the course when re-dropped.

Note 1: If a ball when dropped or re-dropped comes to rest and subsequently moves, the ball must be played as it lies, unless the provisions of any other Rule apply.

Note 2: If a ball to be re-dropped or placed under this Rule is not immediately recoverable (e.g. it plunks into the hazard), another ball may be substituted.

Nearest Point of Relief

The "nearest point of relief" is the reference point for taking relief without penalty from interference by an immovable obstruction (Rule 24-2), an abnormal ground condition (Rule 25-1) or a wrong putting green (Rule 25-3).

It is the point on the course nearest to where the ball lies:

- (i) that is not nearer the hole, and
- (ii) where, if the ball were so positioned, no interference by the condition from which relief sought would exist for the stroke the player would have made from the original position if that condition were not there.

Note: In order to determine the nearest point of relief accurately, the player should use the club with which he would have made his next stroke if the condition were not there to simulate the address position, direction of play and swing for such a stroke.

Remember you determine your nearest point with the club, simulating the shot you would make without the interference. You may then use any club to measure.

Keep in mind in a tournament, you can request a ruling for Ground Under Repair if you are not sure if something is "abnormal ground conditions" (casual water, cast runway from burrowing animal) then play 2 balls, the "golden rule" that if you are unclear how to proceed, announce you will play 2 balls and which you intend to score, and have a ruling made before you sign your scorecard.
