The facility was purchased and renovated by the City of Dallas through the 2003 Bond Program to function as a permanent City-owned arts center where residents and visitors of Oak Cliff could experience a variety of arts and cultural programs. The 5,000 sq. ft. storefront features a visual arts

gallery and a dance studio/rehearsal space. The Oak Cliff Cultural Center is open Tuesday – Thursday, 3:00-9:00 p.m., Friday, 1:00-6:00 p.m., and Saturdays, 10:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m.
