THE OAK CLIFF CULTURAL CENTER PRESENTS PARAGUAYAN PROGRAM *Experience Traditions of Paraguay This Holiday Season*

ONE-DAY EXHIBITION AND LECTURE: WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 29, 2010, 6:30 PM

DALLAS, TX – The Oak Cliff Cultural Center is hosting an evening of Paraguayan art and culture on December 29, 2010, 6:30 PM. Señora Jorgelina Groppi de Cardozo, wife of General Julio César Cardozo (Republic of Paraguay Military Forces Commander), will present an overview (in Spanish) of Paraguayan culture, beginning with a description of seasonal holiday traditions and continuing with the arts that capture the essence of her South American people. From the music of the Paraguayan harp and the slow melancholic rhythms and folk melodies of the Guarania (polka) to the craftsmanship exhibited in Filigrana (filigree jewelry) and Nanduti lace, Señora Jorgelina Groppi de Cardozo will introduce us to the little-known culture of our South American neighbors. She will highlight the history of Paraguay and the source of pride in her nation of grassy plains and wooded hills known as *Corazón de América*.

The evening will commence with a 30-minute exhibition of Paraguayan arts. Señora Jorgelina Groppi de Cardozo will make a short formal presentation on Paraguayan holiday traditions, art, history, and beauty of her country. The Oak Cliff Cultural Center is located at 223 W. Jefferson Blvd., Dallas, TX 75208. The Oak Cliff Cultural Center opened its doors in August 2010. The facility was purchased and renovated by the City of Dallas through the 2003 Bond Program to function as a permanent City-owned arts center where residents and visitors of Oak Cliff could experience a variety of arts and cultural programs. The 5,000 sq. ft. storefront features a visual arts gallery and a dance studio/rehearsal space. The Oak Cliff Cultural Center is open Tuesday – Friday, 3:00-9:00 p.m., and Saturdays, 10:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m.
