***Spanish Brass at the Latino Cultural Center
International Quintet Makes Dallas Debut
Sunday, October 10, 2010 at 3:00 p.m.***

Dallas (September 16, 2010) – The Latino Cultural Center is pleased to present SPANISH BRASS in concert on Sunday, October 10, 2010 at 3:00 p.m. at the LCC’s Oak Farms Dairy Performance Hall (2600 Live Oak, Dallas). Tickets start at \$15 and are available at www.brownpapertickets.com.

Considered one of the world’s top bass quintets, these five musicians from Valencia, Spain, have toured internationally performing in prestigious venues around the world such as the Juilliard School of Music, the Lucerne Festival, the Merano Brass Festival and Trento Philharmonic (Italy) and the Festival de Inverno de Brasilia. They are touring the U.S. in October, beginning in Santa Fe and making their debut in Dallas at the Latino Cultural Center. Spanish Brass has been recording since 1996; their most recent CD, *SBLM*, was published in 2009 and includes music by classical masters Bach and Handel and modern composers Paquito d’Rivera and Antón García Abril. In 2001, the group founded the Alzira Spanish Brass Festival, which has reached over 23,000 people in its nine editions.

“The Latino Cultural Center is thrilled to be able to bring this international group to Dallas,” notes Maria Munoz-Blanco, Dallas Director of Cultural Affairs and Acting General Manager of the Latino Cultural Center. “We look forward to hearing their exciting repertoire, which includes brass interpretations of music by classical and contemporary composers from Spain and Latin America.”
