This matinee series was designed for the theater patron who enjoys an afternoon performance, light comedies or plays that are "old fashioned" in the sense that they tell a good story and are filled with unforgettable characters. Grace and Glorie is the heartwarming story of two women from very different worlds. Between an illiterate old woman fresh home from the hospital and an urbane Harvard-educated MBA volunteering for hospice, which do you think needs saving? Cultures and generations hilariously collide when an illiterate but savvy cantankerous old mountain woman plans to live out her life high in the Blue Ridge Mountains in the little cabin she calls home. The old stove smokes, there is no phone, and there are chickens on the front porch. The Harvard-educated transplanted New Yorker, who is assigned as her hospice volunteer, visits her. *Grace and Glorie* ran Off Broadway and starred Estelle Parsons and Lucy Arnaz. Marty Van Kleeck will direct the One Thirty production, which will star Gene Ray Price and Emily Scott Bank in the title roles. It is a very funny and touching piece, full of revelation and hope—it is no wonder this charming piece was selected as a Hallmark Hall of Fame movie of the week.
