One-Thirty Productions Opens 2011 Season

DALLAS: One-Thirty Productions and the Bath House Cultural Center, in cooperation with the City of Dallas Office of Cultural Affairs, announce the opening of the delightful comedy *The Housekeeper* by James Prideaux. The production opens on Wednesday, March 9 and runs through Saturday March 26.

One-Thirty Productions, Dallas's only senior matinee series, begins its fourth season at the Bath House Cultural Center, and continues to delight audiences and critics alike. The Bath House provides an ideal setting for enjoying an afternoon of light comedy and taking an intermission stroll through the Center's Art Gallery.

Gene Ray Price and Cliff Stephens are paired for this zany two-hander. Audiences may have seen them together a few years ago in One-Thirty's *A Bench in the Sun*. In *The Housekeeper* Stephens is Manly Carstairs, an untalented, pretentious, reclusive writer who has lived at home with his rich domineering mother until her recent death. When he decides to hire an eccentric housekeeper, played by Price, to clean house and cook for him, the fun begins and his life is changed forever. The ensuing antics are conveyed with wit and biting humor in a "hilarious comedy of amorous faux pax." Marty Van Kleeck directs the production, with light design by James Gregory and sound design by Graeme Bice.

All performances start at 1:30 PM, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday, from March 9 to March 26, at the Bath House Cultural Center, 521 E. Lawther Dr., Dallas, Texas 75218.
